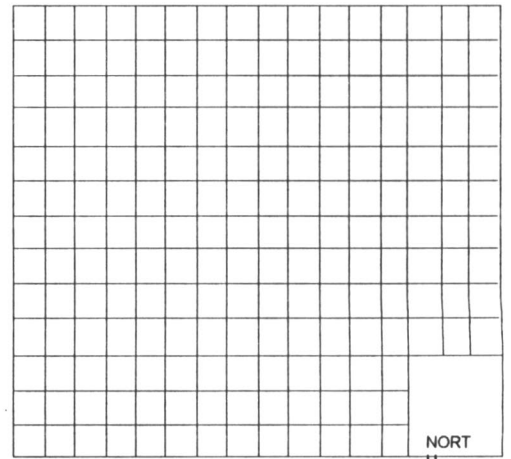

Description: Small storage building with sloping roof. Wooden plank door on front, standard door on side. Exposed rafter tails on front. Roof pitch drops at rear to cover small cement block addition.

Historical Data: Part of infantile paralysis primate research center that was designed to provide research scientists around the world who were seeking a vaccine for polio with monkeys as research subjects. Created in 1945-46 by John Hamlet, working for the National Foundation of Infantile Paralysis. Hamlet designed new feeding, housing, and sanitation measures for this facility. The facility had steel caging to house up to 5000 monkeys at one time. Operated until 1959, after the polio vaccine had been discovered.
