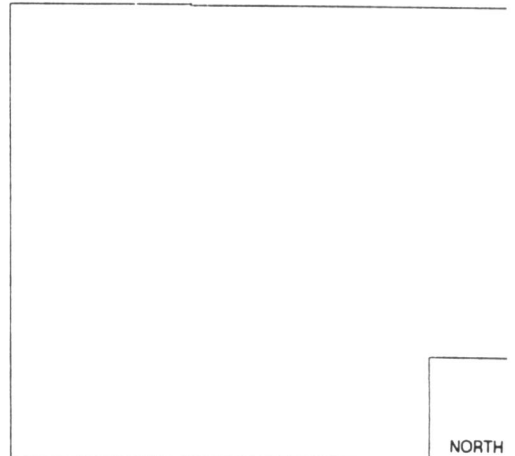

Description: West elevation has two 6-light casement windows; east elevation has band of six 6/6 sash typical of school construction.

Historical Data: Constructed by carpenter-builder Samuel Holmes on a lot donated by Jane Hamilton. Opened as a two-teacher school; closed ca. 1950. After that time the children of Cooper River community attended Mary Fields Elementary. Used as residence of Mrs. Hamilton from ca. 1950 until ca. 1962, then for various community purposes.
