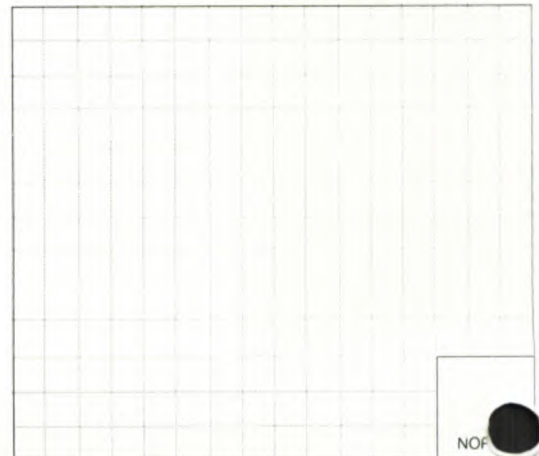

Description: Rectangular 1.5-story frame 5 x 2 bay dwelling w/lateral gable roof. Full-facade shed porch w/chamfered posts and insect screening. Central entrance at facade flanked by two 6/6 double hung sash windows. 6/6 windows at each bay of side elevs. Window at attic level of E elev. only. Rear 1 x 3 bay wing at E w/shed porch at W.

Historical Data: It appears that 906 and 908 10th Street were built as identical houses circa 1920. While 906 is more intact, 908 retains its original chimneys and hipped porch. These houses are similar to the adjacent house at 1003 London Avenue. The London Avenue house is shown on a 1920 plat of Port Royal by A. O. Christensen, while the 10th Avenue houses are not.

Christensen Notes refer to the site as "Attaway House" and list the following chain of title: Daniel F. Appleton to Port Royal Land Co., no date; Port Royal Land Co. to Joe Fripp, 5/9/1894; Joe Fripp to J. K. Attaway, 6/16/1894; J. K. Attaway to A. Bailey, 3/5/1924; A. Bailey to J. O. Williams, 7/8/1926 [this information not verified].
