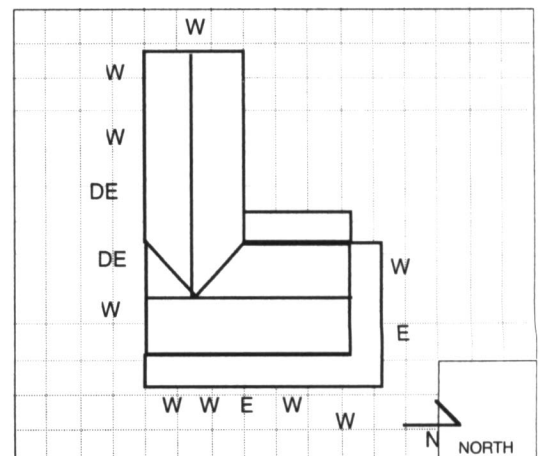

Description: 5 x 2 bay rectangular block w/cross gable rear wing at left, small shed rear addition at right; pedimented gable ends w/rectangular louvered vents; boxed cornice; dawn brackets at porch

Historical Data: According to informant, the house was constructed as a farmhouse for Peter Lee. Peter Lee's farm covered much of what is know as Burton Hill. The house was acquired by the informant's father circa 1940. A kitchen was added about 1945. His family resided there and the house remained occupied until about 7 or 8 years ago.
